MPhil in Chinese Studies / PhD in Chinese Studies

Programme

MPhil in Chinese Studies

The MPhil student is required to complete a minimum of 18 units of courses, including

- Two required courses (a total of 6 units)
- Two elective seminars or courses offered by related programmes and departments (a total of 6 units)
- A Thesis Guidance course every term from the beginning of the second year of study until the Master's thesis is finally submitted (a total of 6 units).

Students are required to complete an M.Phil. thesis and to pass an oral defense of the thesis. English should be used in both the thesis and the oral defense.

At the completion of their programme students will be required to demonstrate ability to read Chinese articles in academic journals in the appropriate field of specialization.

PhD in Chinese Studies

The PhD student is required to complete a minimum of 27 units of courses, including

- Two required courses (a total of 6 units)
- Three elective seminars or courses offered by related programmes and departments (a total of 9 units)
- A Thesis Guidance course every term from the beginning of the second year of study until the doctoral thesis is finally submitted (a total of 12 units).

Students must pass the qualifying examination.

Students are required to complete a Ph.D. thesis, which should make substantial contribution to scholarship in the chosen field of specialization, and to pass an oral defense of the thesis. English should be used in both the thesis and the oral defense.

At the completion of their programme students will be required to demonstrate ability to read Chinese articles in academic journals in the appropriate field of specialization.

Admission Requirements

In addition to the general requirements of the Graduate School¹, applicants should have a good result in Chinese language paper in GCSE, A-level GCE, SAT 1, SAT AP or

equivalent public examinations and be able to demonstrate proficiency in Chinese to work on Chinese materials as needed for the thesis research.

MPhil in Chinese Studies

Applicants should have a good honours degree in an area related to Chinese Studies.

The following materials should be submitted together with the application:

- Documentary proof of the applicant's Chinese standard
- A thesis proposal, written in English
- A paper on a topic related to Chinese Studies, written in English.

PhD in Chinese Studies

Applicants should have a Master's degree in a related area of Chinese Studies.

The following materials should be submitted together with the application:

- Documentary proof of the applicant's Chinese standard
- A detailed English thesis proposal with areas of research interest indicated
- A copy of Master's thesis or a sample research paper, written in English.

The programme emphasizes both theoretical knowledge and research skills.

MPhil in Gender Studies

Students will be assigned to both the Division of Gender Studies and a subject department.

Students need to complete 8 units from the Gender Studies Programme, fulfill the requirements of the subject department and submit a written thesis in order to graduate. The requirements of subject disciplines may be adjusted at the discretion of subject departments.

PhD in Gender Studies

The programme emphasizes both theoretical knowledge and research skills and allows students to bring together different disciplinary and methodological approaches for the advancement of gender studies.

Earning a total of at least 21 units, passing the written qualifying examinations, submitting a thesis and passing an oral examination are required for graduation.

Fields of Specialization

Students will conduct independent research under any department (including but not limited to Anthropology, Cultural Studies, Educational Administration & Policy, History, Japanese Studies, Journalism, Literature, Nursing, Psychology, Sociology or Social Work, and other allied fields) with a focus on gender.



Admission Requirements

In addition to the general requirements of the Graduate School¹,

PhD in Gender Studies

- (i) have some knowledge of gender studies;
- (ii) have good background in their intended field of concentration

Applicants may come from a variety of backgrounds. On their application forms, applicants must indicate the subject discipline for which they wish to be considered. Meanwhile, applicants must present a research proposal providing a brief description of the intended research topic, objectives, and methods. The research proposal should use the academic method and approach characteristic of the applicants' intended subject discipline to explore a topic involving issues of gender. Applications will be jointly considered by the Gender Studies Programme and the subject department.

MPhil Stream

- 1) Students are required to complete a minimum of 15 units for graduation, including a minimum of 9 units of required lecture courses and 6 units of elective lecture courses
- 2) Thesis research course is required to take every term
- 3) Students are required to pass the IT Proficiency Test
- 4) Students are required to submit a research thesis and pass an oral examination for graduate

PhD Stream

- 1) Students are required to complete a minimum of 15 units for graduation, including a minimum of 9 units of required lecture courses and 6 units of elective lecture courses.
- 2) Thesis research course is required to take every term.
- 3) Students are required to pass the IT Proficiency Test.
- 4) Students are required to submit a thesis proposal and make an oral presentation and defence of the thesis proposal.
- 5) Students are required to pass two comprehensive examinations within a period specified.
