



Student IT Proficiency Requirement

All students are required to pass the IT Proficiency Test before they graduate. Students may choose to attend an intensive course before sitting the test. Students who do not pass the test at the first attempt can attend the intensive course again and retake the test. They will be barred from graduation if they do not pass the test. Those admitted in 2004-05 and thereafter and have passed the International Computer Driving Assessment may apply for exemption from the IT Proficiency Test.

Tests will be graded Pass/Fail and multiple attempts are allowed. Upon graduation, the transcript will show 'IT Proficiency Passed'.

Study Mode

The study mode of a postgraduate student may be full-time or part-time. Unless otherwise specified, classes of part-time programmes are scheduled in day time as for full-time programmes. Part-time students have to make their own arrangements to attend day-time classes. All applications concerning the change of study mode must be recommended by Graduate Division concerned and approved by the Dean of the Graduate School.

Concurrent Registration

A student shall not be registered simultaneously in another course of study or research leading to the award of a degree, diploma or certificate either at this University or at any other tertiary institution unless an application has been submitted in advance to the Graduate Division concerned, endorsed by the Faculty concerned and approved by the Graduate Council. A student in breach of this regulation shall be required to discontinue studies at the University.

Academic calendar

The academic year of postgraduate studies of the University runs from August to July.
